01/28/19 (Dr. Bassem Elhassan)	<p>I have a concern about possibility of trapezius dysfunction. She does have significant drooping of the shoulder on X-ray. The treatment plan does change if the trapezius is dysfunctional. In this case the exam is more reliable than EMG. If she has normal strong contraction of the trapezius then most likely the trapezius muscle is elongated leading to the drooping of the scapula. I do agree with Buddy strapping recommendation. The problem with bony reconstruction is the manubrium deficiency. I have done few cases of medial 1/3rd first rib osteotomy and fixed the rib to clavicle end to end and they worked out well.</p> <p>Let us know what you decide to do Cheers B</p>
